International Union for Conservation of Nature - IUCN (Quito/Ecuador):

Andrea Heredia (MEG 5) - Summer 2010

For my internship I worked with the IUCN Regional Office for Southamerica in Quito. It was really interesting because although the internship was related to one specific project for Ecuador, Bolivia and Peru, I was able to interact with other projects in all the countries in the region as well, so the learning options were significantly enhanced:)

Due to my previous working experience I had the opportunity to be included in some interesting areas of the project, so I would really recommend to apply for internships that are not specifically related to your background if you have worked before, you might get the chance to apply your knowledge in a interdisciplinary atmosphere, which is what the MEG Program is all about.

In the case of international organizations, it is also helpful to work in regional offices because there is more possibilities to address local problems and learn much more than if you are working at the Headquarters, but of course it depends on the project you choose.

Non-Governmental Organizations:

Tropenbos International Ghana (TBI, Ghana) - Kumasi, Ghana

Joseph Faniyan (MEG 5) - Summer, 2010

There is no place like being at home and being involved in an ongoing project that is contributing meaningfully to national development. I was actually contacted by my former organisation (employer) to conduct an impact assessment of alternative livelihood interventions implemented in the High Forest Zone of Ghana. This was an action research to provide guidelines for the implementation of similar alternative livelihoods to affected actors in a EU-chainsaw project that is contributing to the review of national forest andwildlife policy. Since it is a research organisation my tasks for the nine week internship included proposal writing, field data collection using mixed method of semi-structured questionnaire and interview protocol, data analysis and report writing. The internship was not paid but I received daily subsistence allowance (DSA) for my field visits - typical of TBI. Ghana.

The resentment in the heart of rural folks for the failure of past alternative livelihood interventions was saddening and also interesting to note; however, their willigness to share their experiences helped to unravel the complexities in alternative livelihood innterventions for rural folks. It was eye-openeing and I discovered leverage points for transforming rural livelihoods to make them sustainable and contribute to rural development. Thus, giving me idea for my thesis as well. Some inconveniences due to unannounced breaks in internet connection and electric power supply give extra time for fun and sometimes pressure to complete task; consituting the wonderful surprises of working in a developing country.

BMZ - Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (Bonn/Germany):

Anja Bursche (MEG 5) - Summer 2010

Department: Environment and Sustainable Use of Natural Resources (other departments e.g.: Agriculture, Urban Planning, Water, Regional departments)

Payment: 100 € /month

Duration: 10 weeks (though minimum requirement usually 12 weeks, but exceptions are possible)

Tasks: I was supervised by the person responsible for Forestry, but I dealt with Biodiversity and Green Economy as well. The main topic of my internship was REDD (Reducing Emissions from Deforestation and Degradation), which was my own choice and Master Thesis research interest. I got a very good overview and valuable contacts. Typical tasks are doing research and writing briefing notes, if you are lucky preparing statements and speeches for the minister or secretary of state, attending meetings and videoconferences (also with other German ministries), attending and reporting about workshops and conferences

Recommendable: Yes, but it can be very political and theoretical - maybe more interesting for you if you already have some practical experience in development cooperation / have stayed in a developing country before. Also, you have to put in a lot of your own initiative to make the internship as interesting as possible, since the supervisors don't have a lot of time for you and the working atmosphere is generally very stressful and disciplined. Ask as many questions as you can, people are generally very nice and accessible. Advice: Clarify your tasks and say what you are most interested in, otherwise you will be overloaded with tasks from everyone in the department. Also, try to make use of all the interesting events of international organisations in Bonn, and the very active intern-mailing-group in the BMZ.

Foreign Ministry of the Federal Republic of Germany, Tokyo, Japan:

Jade Buddenberg (MEG 5) - Spring 2010

Diplomacy has fascinated me long before I studied International Relations and History for my Bachelor. I was lucky to gain a practical insight into this field during an eight week internship in the economic section of one of the biggest German embassies in terms of staff. My application went through the offical website mechanism in November 2008 and I received the confirmation in June 2009.

Having discussed my role well in advance with my supervisor, the head of the economy department, I was lucky enough to work much on the environmental portfolio besides economic issues. This included reporting on the new Japanese energy law that was passed during my stay. Furthermore I was entrusted with handling the tasks of the environment rapporteur during his four week absence. Another highlight for me was visiting the Japanese Environmental Ministry and being albe to join high level meetings on international climate negotiations and renewable energy policy amongst others.

The cultural experience was rich and exciting - I remember my ten week stay as one of the best times of my life. However Tokyo is not easy to live in as a complete stranger and I was glad to be housed with a loving host family and to have the support and company of other interns, collegues and diplomats from other countries.






